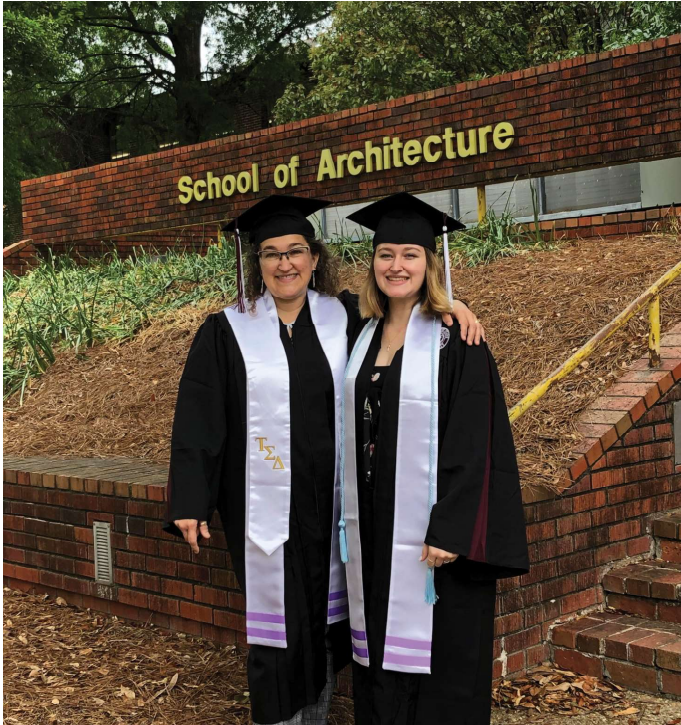

MOST INTERESTING JOB YOU HAVE EVER HAD:

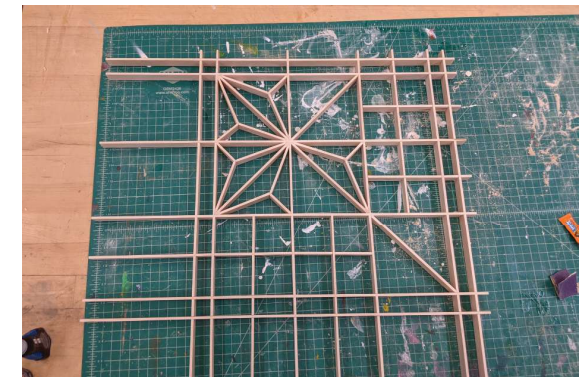
I was a 1st year studio TA during my 4th year, and I enjoyed talking to each student about their projects more than doing my own.
